## KAREN HEAGLE

Two things distinguish Heagle's paintings: the fact that they're painted on paper—which gives them the bright look of posters—and their subjects. Even in the anything-goes world of contemporary art, Heagle hits a high note of oddness. A pregnant man with a Fauvist flecked beard caresses his belly. Voluptuous dark-haired women pose with a snake and a Holstein cow. Several works feature vultures. Heagle's fluid draftsmanship and bright palette show the influence of Matisse, and her Dionysian tone is pure Dana Schutz, but her work's strongest affinity is with the bizarro realm of thrift-store paintings.
