Linen cover edition of 425 Wooden roll top edition of 75 The wooden roll-top box is laser cut with the artist's signature drawing of the hundred headless woman magic trick, an image that also is foil stamped on the linen case. The outside covers of individual books are in vibrant Chinese red and feature the ink-drawing studies for the cutting boards in embossed form. The books present the traditional Chinese string bindings with butterfly fold pages. The first volume includes essays by Sue Scott and Molly Tambor with a foreword by James Surls. Volumes II and III contain images

lavishly illustrating the project.

ROBERT BRINKER has completed a new artist book titled, Recount of the Recount. The book combines political and

personal narratives that reflect on the 2000 presidential election. Brinker's use of vinyl tapes and duct tape throughout the prints and on the book cover act as a clever metaphor for censorship by referencing its use as a tool for gagging. It also asks the questions, "Is it live or taped, real or staged?".

All eight books slide into a book sleeve safely housed inside a larger slipcase.
