Born in France, Emmanuel spent his childhood in remote parts of the world, developing an early taste for travel, which makes him particularly confortable with cross-cultural projects.

In 2003 Emmanuel traveled to North Korea, Mozambique, Cambodia, East Timor, Brazil, and Europe for the documentary "En route to Bagdad" tracing the life of the late United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, Sergio Vieira De Mello (PBS, 2015). In 2012 the documentary "Mekong" had Emmanuel traveling on dugout canoes from the remote mountains of Laos all the way to the Mekong delta for a period of four months. For the French Station Canal + Emmanuel traveled all over France for the documentary "La Table De Noel" looking into how what French people eat for Christmas is produced.

Emmanuel covers the production needs for the aeronautic giant **Safran** from South America to Canada.

Emmanuel has filmed numerous add campaigns, from St Vincent and the Grenadines to New Zealand and China for the advertising agency **Spring O'Brien**.

Covering News in hostile environments is an exercise in keeping sharp and learning to read the signs that let you anticipate the moment keeping up with the challenge to come up with interesting images while working in the instant and visually maintaining the content of the story.
