


Everything is changed.

In **The Before Times** of 2019, Barbara participated in four month-long residencies making paintings and drawings in very different places: a lakeside town in Maine's central highlands; the East End of Long Island; pastoral Upstate New York; and a sprawling industrial park in Barreiro, Portugal, across the bay from Lisbon.

For the past year, the island in her kitchen has been the center of Barbara's universe. She's been knitting, felting, weaving, writing, sewing, taking snapshots, and drawing rather obsessively in accordion-fold albums.

Isolation Journal comprises 49+ volumes of drawings, documenting her time and the minutiae of daily life in COVID isolation, living alone, in coastal Connecticut.







Barbara Marks is known for her small, colorful, semi-abstract paintings, but drawing is her habit. She draws every day, any place, and everywhere. Her imagery is rooted in observation and it departs from it. "I like to call attention to the commonplace and the local. I look where others don't. There's the external world—and then there's me. My paintings and drawings are the intersection of the two. In that respect, they are intimate and personal; perhaps they're narrative."

A child of the sixties, Barbara grew up in Westport, Connecticut. She attended college, studying anthropology, until she fell into graphic design. In 1978, Barbara established her own studio specializing in book design. In 2001, she left that behind to study painting at Lyme Academy College of Fine Arts, earning a BFA (2005) followed by an MFA from Brooklyn College CUNY (2008). Barbara has participated in artist residencies in Europe and across the U.S. and shows her work throughout the Northeast. She divides her time between coastal Connecticut and NYC's Flatiron neighborhood.



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
