INTRODUCTION Audrey S. Kauders, Director

The Museum of Nebraska Art is honored to present the third rendition of its contemporary art invitational exhibition, RSVP/MONA. The title derives from the French phrase, répondez s'il vous plaît (literally, respond if you please), which refers to the call extended to selected artists inviting their participation. The first "call" was made in 2001 by MONA's then Curator James May and the resulting exhibition featured 47 artworks by 27 artists working in Nebraska. Two years later, Josephine Martins, MONA's Curator during that period, invited 20 artists to participate and 44 of their works were on view.

After an interval of five years, MONA's present Curator, Teliza RSVP Rodriguez, has ventured beyond the talented artists living in Nebraska today to those who have a tie to Nebraska, although now living and abbreviation working elsewhere. RSVP/MONA III includes 27 artists, each showing one piece. Eighteen of the exhibiting artists were born in Nebraska, seven received their B.F.A. and/or M.F.A. degrees in Nebraska, and, with the remaining two, one was raised in Nebraska and the other taught at the University of Nebraska. In her essay, Ms. Rodriguez distinuitations to cusses how their Nebraska experiences influence their art, suggesting that time spent in the state has affected each artist as evident in his or ORIGIN Frencher artwork.



With these acquisitions, MONA perpetuates the series beyond the exhibitions and accompanying catalogues – an important additional benefit of organizing this contemporary invitational.

RSVP/MONA celebrates the work of the excellent artists either living in Nebraska presently or connected to the state. We are especially pleased to acknowledge their worth by presenting their works.
