Subway: #7 Flushing IRT train to Willets Point/Shea Stadium station. Follow signs through the park to the museum. October 28 only, trolley service continuously from noon to 6:00 p.m. between Willets Point/Shea Stadium and museum.

Bus: Q48 to Roosevelt Avenue and 111th Street. Walk south to park. Q23 or Q58 to Corona and 51st Avenues. Walk east to park.

Car: Via Grand Central Parkway, exit at Shea Stadium and follow signs in park to museum. Free parking.
