At Carriage Trade, Mother Nature as the Best Modern Artist

THE DAILY PIC (#1794): "American Interior" is a lovely group show at the new <u>Carriage Trade</u> space on the Lower East Side in New York. I'm particularly keen on the way it mixes clever fine-art images of household spaces, altered by such figures as <u>Richard Artschwager</u> and Steel Stillman, with photos that you might call accidentally clever: Normal domestic environments that came to look like contemporary art after a natural disaster of some kind struck them. I'm showing one of those above, while below is documentation of an early <u>Paul McCarthy</u> performance, accurately titled *Plaster Your Head and One Arm into a Wall*, where the (un-)natural disaster
